Judd Foundation Launches Expanded Digital Guide on Bloomberg Connects

Judd Foundation is pleased to announce the launch of an expanded version of its digital guide on Bloomberg Connects. The expanded guide features an Artists A-Z section focused on artists whose works are permanently installed in Judd Foundation spaces; a categorized Watch and Listen section with thematically grouped archival audio; and a Library section with highlights from the library at La Mansana de Chinati/The Block. These expanded and updated resources are intended to further the Foundation's mission of making the artist's spaces, works, and ideas accessible to the public.

Created specifically for Bloomberg Connects and now available in both the digital guide and on the Foundation's website, the series of film portraits feature archival audio of Judd in conversation on a broad range of concerns central to his work. Drawn from lectures, conversations, and interviews, the audio allows users to hear him comment on the permanent installation of his art, the creation of his work, and the development of his spaces. Filmed and produced by Rainer Judd and Terremoto Films, each film portrait includes original footage of Judd Foundation spaces in New York and Marfa—including the floors of 101 Spring Street and individual buildings at La Mansana de Chinati—expanding viewers' experience of these locations beyond guided visits.

Newly launched with the expanded version, the digital guide now features an abridged version of the Index of Works, an online resource available on the Foundation's website. This resource provides a comprehensive list of the permanently installed artworks in New York and Marfa. The Artists A-Z portion of the guide provides users with a brief biography of the artist, a description of the work, its location, and Judd's relationship to the piece and its installation. Serving as a resource for artists, the visiting public, and online audiences, this section of the guide invites viewers to consider works and their installation by Judd, and to explore their placement within spaces, through the updated maps of each building's floor plan.

Throughout the course of the year, Judd Foundation will add tours to the online digital guide which expand on the different themes introduced in the film portraits, including explorations of color and other aspects of Judd's art practice; a focus on architectural and restoration projects in Marfa; and an overview of the ranch and land preservation efforts at Judd's ranch, Ayala de Chinati. Through the expanded 'From the Archives' section users can access resources and investigative studies of the materials housed within the Judd Foundation Archives, the largest holding of material related to the life and work of the artist.

Launched in conjunction with the expanded digital guide, the website continues to serve as the main online platform for the Foundation's archives, program, and research initiatives. Improving the online experience for the public, the site promotes a wider

understanding of Judd's legacy and enduring impact of his work as an artist, writer, architect, and furniture designer.
